

THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS County of sacramento

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1992 Sacramento County Crop Report. The 1992 production value was \$229,948,000, a slight increase over 1991.

Milk continues to be the single highest valued commodity in Sacramento County. Production was slightly improved over 1991, as was the total value. The estimated value of market milk was 6.4% higher than in 1991, with a total value of \$35,550,000.

Pear production was improved from 1991, despite unseasonably cool weather in the spring, which resulted in maturity problems and harvesting difficulties for many of our producers. The 1992 gross value of pears was \$31,910,000. Grape production was, also, improved from 1991 with slightly higher tonnage and an increased number of acres coming into production. Wine grapes were valued at \$21,525,000, up 28% over 1991 estimates. On the down side was certified sudan seed, where a 5,000 acre reduction in planted acreage resulted in a corresponding \$4.28 million decrease in value.

The values reported in the crop report are gross values and in no way reflect income to the producer. There is a wide variety of production and marketing costs, not a part of this report, which must be considered when attempting to calculate income.

I would like to thank the producers of Sacramento County who provided the information for this report. I, also, express appreciation to my staff, and especially to Keith Miller, Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, who gathered the information and compiled this report.

ORGANIC FARMING

There is limited Certified Organic Farming activity in Sacramento County. However, many local growers for the Sacramento Certified Farmers Markets produce fruit and vegetables using no chemical pest control and depend entirely on organic farming methods. Most, if not all, of our commercial producers of agricultural commodities use recognized integrated pest management techniques in their farming operations.
