

THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS County of Sacramento

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1995 Sacramento County Crop Report. The 1995 production value was \$228,761,000 a slight increase from the REVISED 1994 production.

Milk continues to lead Sacramento County commodities with a value of \$37,548,000. This is almost identical to last years' value. The area dairymen however, are reeling under the effects of high feed prices and a complete collapse of slaughter prices and are experiencing a very difficult time for their industry.

Pear production value dropped sharply due to inclement weather and sizing problems. Value was estimated at \$25,978,000. Pears continue to lead all other crop categories as Sacramento County continues to lead the state in pear production.

Beef prices are extremely depressed with no relief expected soon. Values estimated for 1994 were revised downward with new inventory estimates and values for 1995 were estimated at \$7,809,000. These are by far the lowest estimates in memory.

Other crop values remained fairly stable which is reflected in the county production total. The values reported are gross values and in no way reflect income to the producer. There are a variety of production and marketing costs, not a part of this report, that must be considered when attempting to calculate income.

I would like to express my thanks to the producers of Sacramento County who provided the information for this report. I also appreciate the efforts of my staff, particularly Deputy Agricultural Commissioner, Keith Miller and Vicki Brewer for compiling, and producing this report.
