THE HONORABLE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS County of Sacramento

In accordance with the provisions of Section 2279 of the California Food and Agricultural Code, I am pleased to submit the 1997 Sacramento County Crop Report. Crop production value for 1997 was a record \$253,226,000, an \$8.8 million increase from the 1996 estimates.

Milk continues to lead Sacramento County commodities with a value of \$42,249,000, despite a nearly one million dollar decrease in value from the previous year. More milk was produced in Sacramento County than in the previous year, despite impacts from flooding along the Consumnes River in January that seriously impacted several county dairy operations. However, the total value was reduced due to decreases in milk market price of over one dollar per hundred weight.

For the third consecutive year, wine grapes lead crop production values in Sacramento County with a total value of \$41,857,000. Wine grapes are fast becoming a very significant part of the local economy and are expected to surpass milk as the highest valued commodity in Sacramento County within the next year or two. Pear value increased from the previous year due to improved yields while prices remained stable. Total pear value is estimated to be \$28,339,000 and production continues to lead the state.

Livestock values were much improved from the previous year due to significant increases in the value of turkeys and the improved demand for larger birds. Turkey production was valued at \$18,757,000, almost twice the previous year's value. Cattle prices were only slightly improved from the previous year while cattle inventories remain depressed. Total value of cattle and calves is estimated to be \$6,860,000, which continues a six year decline in the cattle industry in Sacramento County.

Nursery values have slipped slightly from the previous year, however, local production and distribution of ornamental nursery stock remains very stable with an estimated value of \$14.6 million.

Other crop values remained fairly stable which is reflected in the county production total. The values reported are gross values and in no way reflect income to the producer. There are a variety of production and marketing costs, not a part of this report, that must be considered when attempting to calculate income.

I would like to express my thanks to the producers of Sacramento County who provided the information for this report. I also appreciate the efforts of my staff, particularly, Ramona Saunders for compiling the report and Vicki Brewer for producing it.
